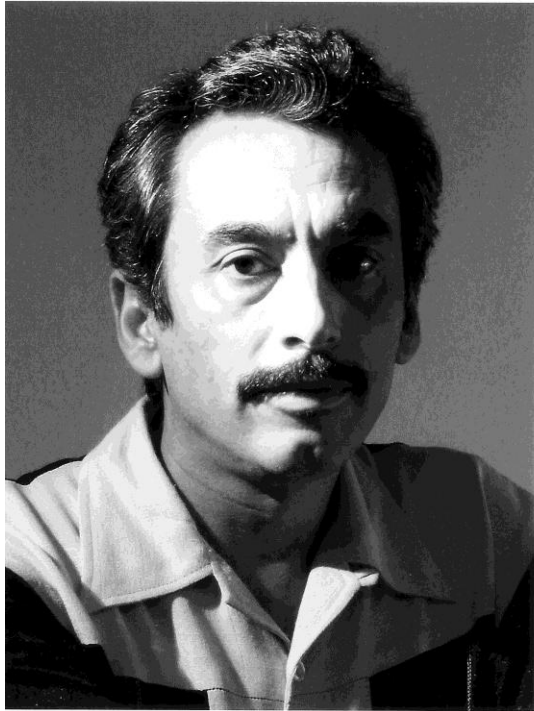
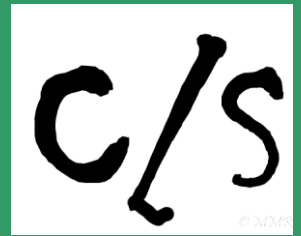

He is also the author of *The Medicine of Memory* (2002), which highlights the Mission District in the 1970s during the Nicaraguan Solidarity movement, and of *Oración a la mano poderosa* (1972). He is a founding member and the first director of The Mission Cultural Center. He is currently a professor in Latina/Latino Studies at San Francisco State University. His forthcoming books include *Native Tongue* and *Xaguar Codex*.
