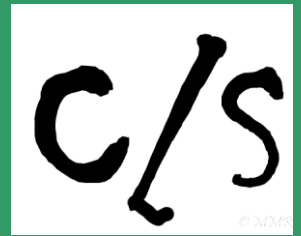

Dr. Hayes-Bautista is Professor of Medicine and Director of the Center for the Study of Latino Health and Culture at the School of Medicine, UCLA. Dr. Hayes-Bautista's research focuses on the dynamics and processes of the health of the Latino population using both quantitative data sets and qualitative observations. The Center for the Study of Latino Health and Culture combines these research interests with teaching of medical students, residents and practicing providers to manage the care of a Latino patient base effectively, efficiently and economically. His publications appear in *Family Medicine*, the *American Journal of Public Health*, *Family Practice*, *Medical Care* and *Salud Pública de México*. He is the author of *El Cinco de Mayo: An American Tradition* (2012), and *Nueva California* (2004), among other books.
