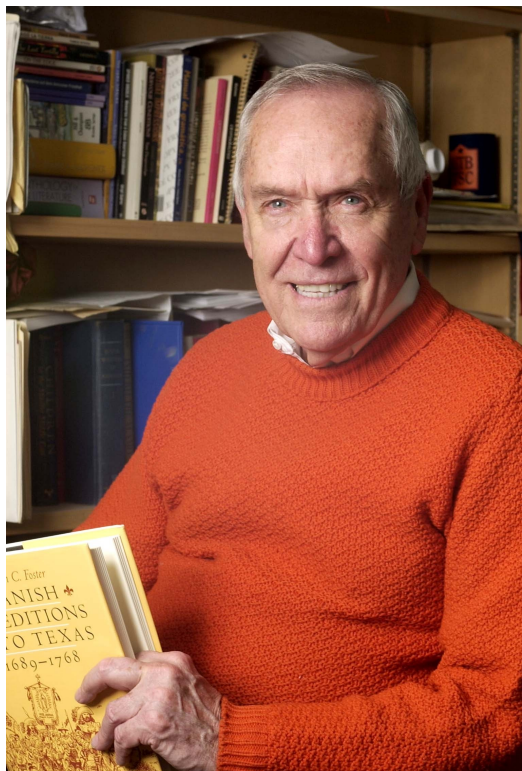

Born in 1929 in Mercedes, Texas, Hinojosa has devoted most of his career as a writer to his "Klail City Death Trip Series," an ever expanding novel that comprises fifteen volumes to-date, from *Estampas del Valle y otras obras* (1973) to *We Happy Few* (2006). Rolando Hinojosa is the recipient of many literary awards, among them the Quinto Sol Annual Prize (1972) and the Premio Casa de las Américas (1976), one of the most prestigious literary prizes in Latin America. Hinojosa is the Ellen Clayton Garwood professor in the English Department at the University of Texas at Austin.
